2. Libori Summer School: Émilie Du Châtelet: Matter, Bodies, Forces, Motion (Paderborn University; July 23rd to 28th, 2017)

This Libori Summer School focuses on some of the chapters from Du Châtelet's Institutions de physique (1740/42) within the context of the scientific thinking of her time. The lecturers Prof. Dr. Ruth Hagengruber, Dr. Andrea Reichenberger and Dr. Dr. Dieter Suisky will analyse Du Châtelets wto take a closer look on the complexities and interrelations between metaphysical reasoning, mathematical demonstrative methodology, and experimental philosophy beyond the outdated empiricism-rationalism scheme, focusing on the conceptual foundations and formations of theories of motion.
