Libori Summer School: Helene Druskowitz and Modern Misandry (Paderborn University, July 23rd to 28th, 2017) The focus of our investigation of the two 19th century movements, feminism and misandry, will be on Helene (von) Druskowitz (1856–1918).



She was a severe critic of Nietzsche's works. As an antithesis to his antifeminist positions, Druskowitz forms her radically feminist position that culminates in her work Pessimistic Cardinal Propositions – Man as a Logical and Moral Impossibility from 1905. In it, she depicts a dark futuristic philosophical anti-utopia.
