3. Talk: Marieke Borren – “Public Space, Performative Freedom, and Embodiment” (Paderborn University, November 16th, 2017)

Dr. Borren argues that Butler is right in demonstrating that performative freedom refers not just to discourse (speech) but also, and maybe even more fundamentally, to embodied collective performances. Assemblages of bodies in public space are not merely pre-political, as Arendt thinks, but in themselves already politically meaningful.
