

First Digital and Historical-critical Edition of the Paris Manuscripts



The “Center for the History of Women Philosophers and Scientists” (HWPS) at the University of Paderborn began its work on the first historical-critical edition of the Paris manuscripts of the main philosophical work of the philosopher, mathematician and physicist Émilie Du Châtelet at the beginning of January 2021. With the edition of the revision stages of the *Institutions de physique* as they are revealed in the manuscripts, the printed version of which first appeared in 1740, a direct connection is made to the Center’s edition of Du Châtelet’s early writings, the so-called Saint Petersburg Manuscripts, which are available online on the [HWPS-website](#). The edition project, initially limited to 2 years, is funded by the German Research Foundation, led by Prof. Dr. Ruth Hagenruber, Director of the Center, and organized by Dr. Hanns-Peter Neumann. Neumann made his debut at the Center on January 4, 2021 and will be largely responsible for the editorial work on the Paris manuscripts. Like the Saint Petersburg Manuscripts, this new milestone in the recent publication history of Du Châtelet’s works will be presented in a reader-friendly online edition. 
Videos: EchoTechGender Visions
