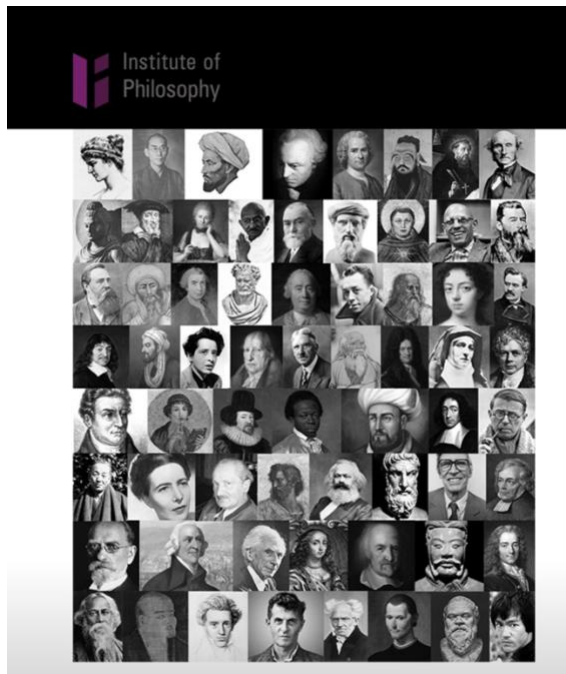

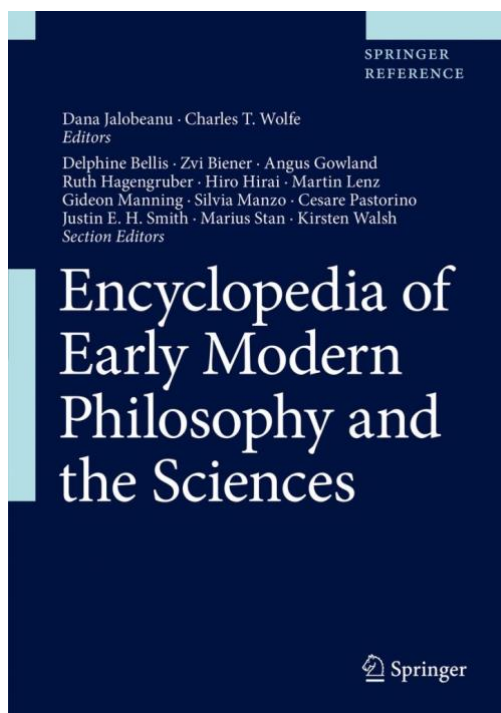


Fighting Philofolly! Rewriting the History of Philosophy at the Summer School 2021: In and Out – Questioning the Philosophical Canon

Ruth E. Hagengruber, director of the Center for the History of Women Philosophers and Scientists, will give a course at the Institute of Philosophy Zagreb's Summer School on June 28, 2021.

Lady Reason criticizes Christine de Pizan for idolatring philosophers, who « like to quote the authors they have read», writing «philofolly», instead of «philosophy». The exclusion of women philosophers from the history of philosophy is a result of the centuries-old practice of gendered-minded self-interest of certain groups, supported by a culturally established patriarchal hierarchy.

“Essential ideas significantly connected to humanism, Renaissance, and early modern philosophy stem from women’s pens. The supportive role of women in the early modern period has hardly been recognized up to today... Women evaluated sources from antiquity, retracing their own legacies back to the figures of the ancient period. As a result, a number of listings of women’s traces can be found in that period, partly documentary, partly mythical. This sort of encyclopedic endeavor of retracing a tradition was in line with and even encouraged a tendency in that period to support women’s inclusion. Examples can be found from 1400–1750.”

On 30 April, the Sophie la Roche Prize of the German Academic Women's Association (DAB) e.V. will be awarded to Elke Büdenbender as part of the online conference *Women from All Women's Countries Shape the Future of Germany*. The award ceremony will be celebrated with an address by Manuela Queitsch, President of the German Academic Women's Association, and a laudatory speech by Auma Obama, founder of the Sauti Kuu Foundation. This will be followed by a roundtable discussion with Jutta Allmendinger, Petia Genkova, Aylâ Neusel, Linn Selle and Parto Teherani-Krönner on the topic of women from all over the world shaping Germany's future, hosted by Ruth Hagengruber, Vice President of the German Academic Women's Association and Professor of Philosophy at the University of Paderborn.



Completing the History of Philosophy - Aiming for a Platform for Research in Germany: Call for Participation!

Research into the history of women philosophers, their contributions and ideas is attracting growing interest worldwide. In the German-speaking world, too, research in this field has reached a considerable scale and is being carried out by a number of researchers in numerous projects and realized by an increasing number of committed philosophers. It is therefore also time to advance the research and processing of the results obtained from this new history, its integration into established research and into established institutions. In cooperation with the AG Frauen in der Geschichte der Philosophie (Women in the History of Philosophy Working Group) and the Center for the History of Women Philosophers and Scientists, experience is available to support this implementation. At this point we would like to take a first step in this creating this network and hear your ideas and suggestions, experiences and ideas on how we can best achieve this goal.
