2) IAPH International Workshop in Madrid (Autonomous University of Madrid UAM/Institute of Women's Research) 1-2 December.

As in previous years, a preparatory Workshop has been organised prior to the Biannual Symposium.

On this occasion, for two days some of the Board members, together with Spanish colleagues from the IAPH, met to present their recent research. The topic was Feminism and Philosophy: New and Old Questions. The Workshop was sponsored by IAPH and IUEM (Institute for Women's Research). Among the topics discussed were the elaboration of an inclusive philosophical canon, from western and non-western Philosophers, the complexities of artificial intelligence in the reproduction of epistemic injustices, the new and different forms of violence against women and the problems of the digitalised public sphere in relation to gender inequalities. Perspectives from Europe, India, Latin América and EEUU provided a transnational understanding and dialogue between different philosophical points of views. In accordance with the objectives of the IAPH, the Workshop provides a forum for discussion, interaction and cooperation among women engaged in teaching and research in all aspects of philosophy, with a particular emphasis on feminist philosophy. 3) Open access: the 1st volume of the Journal of the History of Women Philosophers and Scientists is out now. This inaugural volume of the Journal of the History of Women Philosophers and Scientists aims to clarify methodological issues that emerge when we rediscover the history of women philosophers. It is devoted to the questions which go hand in hand with the rediscovery of the history of women philosophers and scientists, asking whether and how we should place these newly discovered texts within the traditional patriarchal context.
