







#### **Kant**

For many years, Ruth Hagengruber and her research group dedicated their endeavor to unveil the importance and influence of Du Châtelet's reading for Kant presenting the results in <u>Du Châtelet and the Transformation of Metaphysics</u>, <u>Emilie Du Châtelet and the German Enlightenment</u> and <u>Époque Emilienne</u>. On <u>February 9 and 10</u>, the world's first conference on Du Châtelet and Kant took place at the Centre for the History of Women Philosophers and Scholars. A group of international scholars spoke at the hybrid workshop on <u>Du Châtelet</u> and Kant, discussing them from the perspective of the history of philosophy, but also with respect to their influential heritage in more recent philosophy and physics.

# Chapter Five of Du Châtelet's Institutions de Physique




